



<p>Friday 21</p>	<p>10.15</p> <p>10.45</p> <p>12.00</p>	<p><i>The Library will be open until 12.15.</i></p> <p>Marlene will introduce the latest book by S G MacLean for the Readers' Discussion Group. <i>In 1746, Jacobite Iain MacGillivray is left for dead on Drummoissie Moor after the battle of Culloden. A few years later, he is a respectable bookseller - until he finds a stranger murdered in his shop. A sword with a white cockade on its hilt (the emblem of the Jacobites) lies beside the body, and Iain is drawn inexorably into solving the crime. On one level this is an exciting adventure story, with plots, spies, long-hidden secrets and shocking betrayals. On a deeper level, the author portrays a haunting sense of an occupied country still reeling from the slaughter at Culloden, and from the brutal reprisals that followed. The Bookseller of Inverness is a story of revenge and murder, with a surprising twist at the end. It is also a thought-provoking novel that skilfully combines fact with fiction to offer a fresh insight into the aftermath of the battle.</i></p> <p>Improve your Bridge with John</p>
